On April 2, Dr. Dale Parson and his students, Hallie Langley and Danielle Emily Hoch, presented their research paper “Timbral Data Sonification from Parallel Attribute Graphs” at the 31st Annual PA Computing and Information Science Educators Conference, hosted this year at Kutztown University. PACISE is an organization of the computer science departments of PASSHE universities, with other regional colleges and universities participating. Their research translates established means for visualizing data into novel means for detecting patterns in data by listening to sounds generated from that data. Parson, Langley and Hoch received the Best Faculty Paper Award for their work.

### KU HISTORY

In April of 1887, Keystone State Normal School opened a new chapel building which is connected to Old Main via two bridges. The building contained a kitchen and dining room on the first floor, a chapel for 1,200 on the second floor and recitation rooms and dormitory rooms on the third floor. The chapel is now known as the Georgian Room and the building is the C wing of Old Main.
